Evaluation

Carry out an evaluation of performance of use and in the functional role where the application will be interior or exterior

2

Humidity

Verify the humidity conditions of the place of application, since if it presents faults of any importance, it is practically certain that in a short time problems will arise due to poor adherence of the coating, in addition to the lack of good mechanical stability, the surface is flat and uneven over time.

Various maintenance

Any coating material is frequently exposed to mechanical, physical, chemical and biological conditions that compromise and threaten its performance. Therefore, it is important to have an optimal material for each need and have the appropriate characteristics to provide greater performance and resistance to these factors to which it is exposed. Having the right materials in the future will minimize maintenance, restoration or remodeling costs at the time.

Esthetic

The choice of materials must be homogeneous to the harmony of the concept, landscape and stay of the project (place). An adequate and select variety of materials will provide: Added value, Elegance and Distinction. Today the design of residential or commercial projects has focused on the development of environments and styles in maximum comfort of setting.

Advantages of petrous materials

Marble is the material par excellence, with a variety of finishes and qualities. In general, it is a very resistant coating that withstands the passage of time and the aggressive action of external agents. To make the right choice, it is advisable to know in advance the characteristics that distinguish each type of stone. They have excellent weather resistance and are of unlimited duration. They are in the first place, unlike porcelain tiles, with an initial cost, but with a minimum future maintenance expense.
